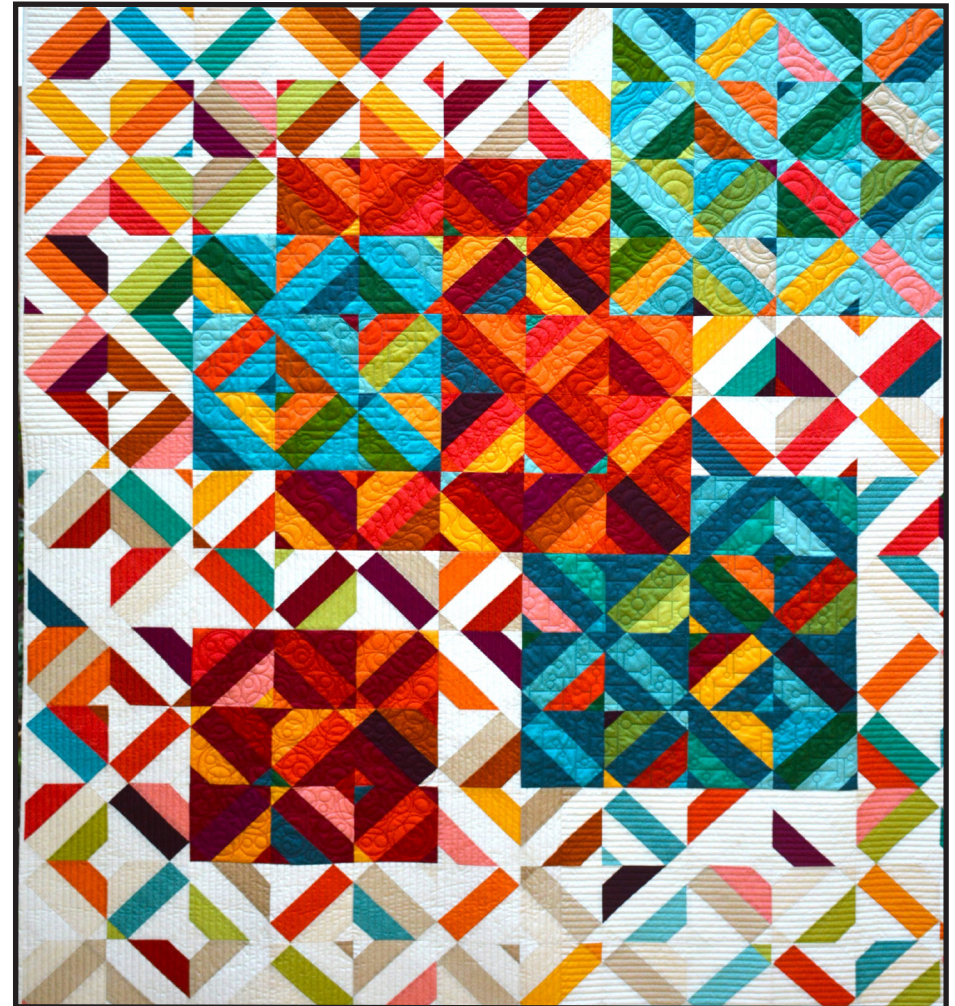

About the Guild



In 1982, a small group of women who shared a love of quilting founded the East Cobb Quilters' Guild. Forty-four years later, the Guild has more than 300 members from throughout the greater Atlanta metropolitan area and beyond. This dynamic group includes traditional and contemporary art quilters, beginners and nationally known experts.

Membership is open to anyone interested in quilting. Visit the Guild Welcome Area on the lower level for an application or sign up online. Meetings are the last Friday morning of each month in Marietta. Our Evening Group meeting is the night before. Visitors and new members are always welcome! Programs and workshops from national and international quilters, as well as local quilting celebrities, are enjoyed monthly. Members also enjoy a newsletter, an extensive library, community service opportunities, bee groups, and friendships to last a lifetime.

Community Service

The East Cobb Quilters' Guild has a long history of community service. Members give freely of their time and energy to create great quilts and other items for donation to area charities. Often gathering in small groups to sew, members also benefit from the friendships that develop and deepen while these projects are created.

Our quilts are distributed to boys and girls through Cobb County Family and Children Services and the Barbara Crafton Center for Women at the Extension. Sick children in area hospitals receive handmade pillowcases through Ryan's Case for Smiles. Placemats are given to older adults and disabled individuals through Meals on Wheels.

Our local school system works with thousands of children each year experiencing homelessness. This year, the Guild will be making flannel blankets for many of them.

Working with Children's Healthcare and Northside Hospital, members make bereavement diapers, scent pads, neonatal small pillowcases, and teddy bears. Members also make Beads of Courage Bags for children with serious illnesses.

"Matriotism - Celebrating 250 Years of Inspirational American Women Through Quilts" was the 2025 Quilt Challenge for the East Cobb Quilters' Guild. Inspired by the nation's commemoration of the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776, the Guild desired to recognize the women who shaped our nation, especially as many of their contributions are historically overlooked or overshadowed. Members researched our nation's women, then designed and created original works to celebrate the extraordinary achievements of our country's mothers, aunts, sisters, and friends. Fifty-two of the resulting 62 quilts are displayed in room **G6** on the upper floor, while the remainder are located among the judged quilts downstairs. Join us in celebrating women of all backgrounds, whose achievements in the arts, government, science, and social and community service have enriched our nation.

Members who contributed to the exhibit are denoted with **M*** in the program listings.

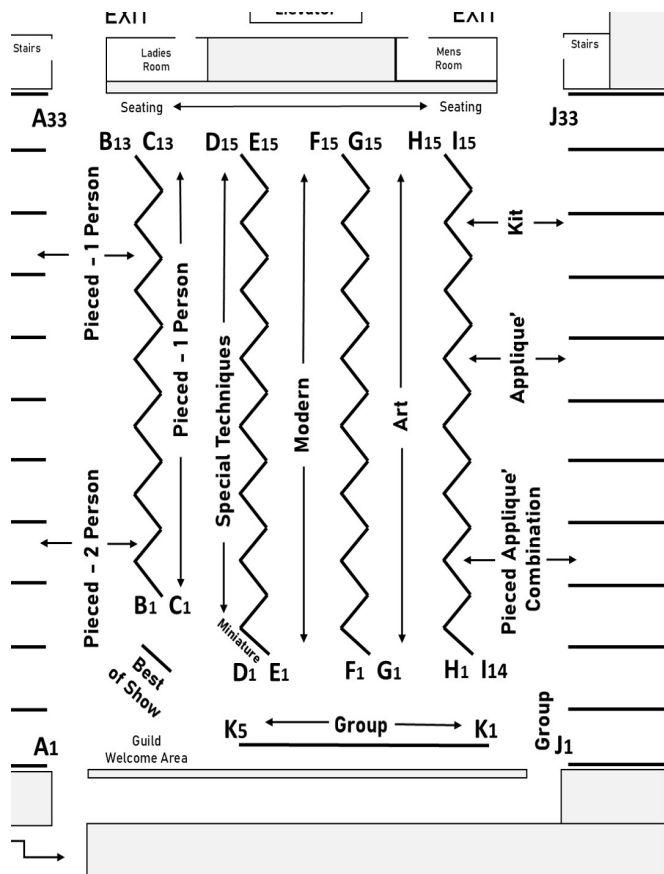

Lisa Schreck

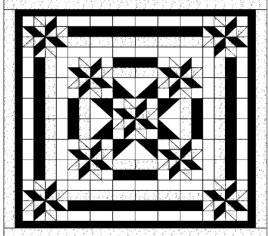
